Health Insurance/Travel Insurance	Japanese National Health Insurance (NHI) is compulsory (approx. JPY2,000/m. Varies according to city/ward where a student resides). Must apply on arrival at local city/ward office. Besides the above, it is highly recommended that students arrange appropriate overseas travel insurance in their home country, which should cover their study period in Japan.		
University Fitness Center	Membership fee is JPY3,000/per academic year. Students are required to take a Fitness Center orientation and university health check-up in order to use the center.

Tutor (Buddy) System	Student volunteers (mostly local Japanese students) will be assigned to provide peer support on school and day-to-day matters.
